What Is It All About?

The UK Census is our primary source of socio-demographic data for geographies from national down to sub-local authority small areas and for samples of individuals. The 1991 Census was the first since 1911 to include a direct health-related question on 'limiting long-term illness' (LLTI). The 2001 Census repeated the LLTI question and this was supplemented with questions on general health and the provision of informal care. These health measures can be investigated alongside other Census variables on tenure, economic activity and ethnicity, for example, and relationships explored with Census-derived deprivation scores.

This conference, organised by the Local Authorities Research and Intelligence Association (LARIA), the Centre for Census and Survey Research (CCSR) and the Local Government Association (LGA), brings together a wide range of speakers from academic, local authority, regional observatory and Department of Health backgrounds. Between them, these researchers have a wealth of practical health-related experience and all attending this seminar will benefit greatly from their experiences.
